CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS/EXTENDED ABSTRACT SUBMITTAL

A required conference proceedings containing "Extended Abstracts" will be published from oral and visual papers presented at this conference. In general, the goals of these "Extended Abstracts" are to: (1) provide a written record of the papers presented at this conference, (2) identify the contributors to the extent others can easily contact authors at a later date if more information is desired, and (3) provide enough detail to fully capture the work reported at the conference without compromising the possibility that the work could be published in a refereed journal in the future.

The following information describes the deadline, content, and format expectations for your extended abstract.

DEADLINE: THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 1, 2007

Please e-mail your extended abstract as a "Word"™ document attachment to Mikel Robinson at mikel.robinson@umontana.edu

Length:

- The total length of each extended abstract will be no more than two pages, single-spaced, one column wide.

Content:

Please organize your abstract into three sections "Boldly" labeled as follows:

- **Introduction**
- **Methods**
- **Results**
- **Literature Cited**

Title and Contact Information:

- Please follow the format as on the first page of an article in the International Journal of Wildland Fire (IJWF) for this aspect of your abstract. Specifically,
 - for the Title: use Times New Roman Bold, 14 point type font (ptf)
 - for listing Authors: use 12 ptf, Times Roman italics for names, and 10 ptf in Times Roman for affiliation and addresses.
 - include an e-mail address for the corresponding author.
 - Include up to 6 key words, using the type set as shown in the IJWF.

Body Text:

- Use Times New Roman Regular, 12 ptf for all text in the body of the abstract
- Refrain from using Tables and figures.
- References might be particularly helpful in the methodology section. If used, cite literature using the abbreviation format found in Science

Margins:

- The binding margin will be 1.5 inches (3.8 cm) wide and the outside edge will be 0.5 inches (1.3cm) in width. The margins at the top and bottom of each page will be 1.2 inches (3cm) and .075 inches (2cm), respectively. Again, use the front page of an article in the IJWF for guidance.

Headers and footers:

Please DO NOT put any information in the header or footer.
