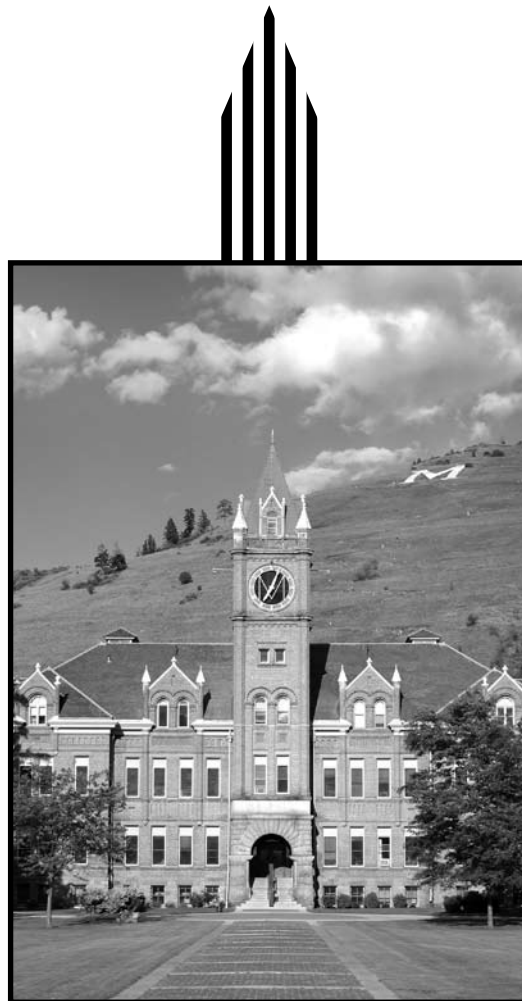

# Applying to The English Language Institute

## ■ When to apply

**English Language Institute Admissions Only:** There is a **Priority Processing Deadline** for admission to the English Language Institute. We encourage students to apply two months before the start of the semester. For example, if the semester begins August 21, the Priority Processing Deadline would be June 21. Students who apply after the Priority Processing Deadline may be accepted on a space available basis. However, in some cases, you may be accepted for a future semester.

**Conditional Admission:** Students who do not have the required English Language Proficiency (TOEFL) score, but are academically qualified for admission to The University of Montana, may be considered for Conditional Admission.

All students admitted conditionally will be required to attend the English Language Institute until they meet the English Language requirement. Students are eligible to begin studies in their academic majors once they achieve one of the following:

- 500 Paper TOEFL/173 Computer Based TOEFL/61 Internet Based TOEFL
- ELI Recommendation

There is also a **Priority Processing Deadline** for Conditional Admission which is two months before the start of the semester. For example, if the semester begins August 21, the Priority Processing Deadline would be June 21. Students who apply after the Priority Processing Deadline may be accepted on a space available basis. However, in some cases, you may be accepted for a future semester.

## ■ Notification of Admission

Once a student's completed international application is received an admission decision will be made. A letter of acceptance and an I-20 form will be sent when a student has been admitted. The I-20 is used to obtain an F-1 student visa. Information regarding orientation, the registration process, and other important information will be mailed directly to the student.

## ■ Application Requirements

The following materials should be submitted to The English Language Institute, The University of Montana, Missoula, Montana 59812 USA FAX (406) 243-6194.

1. Applicants must submit the enclosed Application for the English Language Institute.

### 2. Application Fee

A US\$30 non-refundable fee is required of all applicants before the application can be processed. You may pay the application fee with a credit card or an international money order.

### 3. Statement of Financial Support

A statement of financial support verifies that funds will be available to you to cover estimated costs for one academic year. **This reference letter or statement must be from a bank or financial institution regarding the current funds of a financial sponsor, the student or the parent. \*See page 6, total estimated costs, for funds required on the statement of financial support.**

4. Photocopy of your passport page that shows your full name and picture.

### 5. Visa Clearance and Adviser's Recommendation Form

This form is required only for students who are transferring from another college or university within the United States. The form will be provided to applicants as needed.

## ■ Guaranteed On-Campus Housing

On-Campus housing is guaranteed for international students who submit a housing application and deposit of U.S. \$120. A housing form will be included in the acceptance packet. You are encouraged to submit an application by April 1 in order to avoid a temporary dormitory assignment for fall semester.

## ■ Pre-Registration Immunization Requirements Form

All students entering The University of Montana and the English Language Institute are required to have a record of a recent physical examination showing a physician-validated immunization record. You may download this form and a list of the required immunizations from the following website:

\*Costs vary according to the number of meals you eat each day. Students must choose their meal plans when they arrive at the English Language Institute.

## Explanation of expenses

**Tuition/fees.** The tuition and fees shown on this page are for a full-time student. In addition to basic educational costs, tuition and fees support services such as student activities and provide access to the Curry Health Center, computer services and athletic events. An orientation fee of \$65 is assessed the first semester only. Tuition and fees are paid on a semester basis.

**Room/board.** The estimate is based on a double-occupancy room and the most popular meal plan. UM also offers suites, single-room housing options, and various meal plans, which would affect room and board costs. It is very important to register for housing as soon as you have been admitted. **Direct costs.** These costs are paid directly to ELI in the form of tuition and fees.

**Books and supplies.** Books and school supplies vary depending upon each course. Textbooks and other materials can be purchased at the University Center Bookstore.

**Personal expenses.** Personal expenses include local travel, entertainment, and other costs that vary greatly with lifestyle. For instance, parking permits cost \$165 per year for a car.

**Health insurance.** UM requires all students to have medical insurance for hospitalization or referral beyond UM's Curry Health Center. Students may purchase *Blue Cross/Blue Shield* of Montana major medical insurance at the beginning of each semester. Students who can prove that they have insurance that is equal to or better than *Blue Cross/Blue Shield* are eligible to waive this insurance at registration. Insurance purchased Spring Semester will continue to cover students through the summer.

**Total estimated costs.** This is the amount to be covered in addition to tuition, fees, room and board on the statement of financial support required for admission. It appears on the I-20 Form as follows:

**Summer living expenses.** International students may choose to remain in the U.S. during the regular three-month vacation period (mid-May through mid-August), which is not part of the regular academic year. Students who stay in the U.S. should plan to spend at least another \$1,500 for living expenses. Students who wish to enroll for summer semester courses should expect to pay tuition and fees as noted above in the program costs.
