The Society for Occupational and Environmental Health will hold a conference on fibrous and particulate dust at the Mayflower Hotel in Washington, D.C., December 4-7, 1977. The conference, titled "Occupational Exposures to Fibrous and Particulate Dust and Their Extension into the Environment," is co-sponsored by the Mining Enforcement and Safety Administration.

Presentations by prominent scientists from the United States and abroad will be featured. Speakers will discuss their most current research findings on the health effects of fibrous materials, man-made fibers and particulate matter. Conference sessions will focus on mortality and morbidity patterns among occupationally-exposed populations, including mineral wool production workers, talc miners and millers, foundry workers, and asbestos workers. Consumer, family and environmental exposures will be considered.

The conference will also cover current concepts and theories on fiber pathogenicity with attention to the following fibers: tremolite, vermiculite, zeolite, fiberglass and asbestos. The final conference session will deal with health implications and will feature discussion by representatives of governmental agencies with regulatory responsibilities. Because of the ubiquitous nature of fibrous and particulate dust, various agencies have such responsibility. These include the Environmental Protection Agency, the Mining Enforcement and Safety Administration, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration and the Consumer Product Safety Commission.

Conference Co-Chairpersons are Mr. John Dement of the University of North Carolina and Mr. Richard Ikenen of the University of Illinois. Located in Washington, D.C., SOEH is a nonprofit organization with membership from academia, government, industry, labor, and the public interest sector.

A preliminary program and a registration form are enclosed. Advance registration is recommended because of limited space. The SOEH Award Banquet must be subscribed in advance.
