TRIO Student Support Services

TRIO SSS offers an array of academic support to eligible students throughout their college careers. TRIO SSS offers students additional academic advising, tutoring, career advising, financial aid assistance, book loan program, college skills workshops, peer mentoring, and specific courses designed to build college-readiness skills. To participate in TRIO, students must meet at least one of the following eligibility requirements: be a first-generation college student, qualify for low-income status under federal financial aid guidelines, or have a documented physical or learning disability.
