By filling out this referral form, you will be alerting CIRT that a student was recently or is still in a crisis. This will permit a supportive response to ensure the student receives necessary assessment and help. Please provide whatever information you can and submit this form to the Dean of Students.

You may report anonymously or request that your identity remain confidential. Nothing herein shall be interpreted to modify any legal requirements applicable to licensed health care professionals' disclosures of health care information protected by health and medical confidentiality laws.
