The **General Sociology Major** requires a minimum of 33 sociology credits. Students may choose an option in **Criminology, Inequality & Social Justice, or Rural and Environmental Change**, which requires 39 sociology credits. No more than 60 sociology credits may count toward graduation. All courses to be applied toward the 33/39 credit minimum must be taken for a letter grade; you must earn a C- or better in each course.
