

UM GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS (GER)

Beginning Autumn 2004, all UM general education courses must be taken for a traditional letter grade.

Beginning Autumn 2009, only UM and transfer courses graded C- or above in all Groups count toward GER requirements. See UM Catalog.

TRANSFER STUDENT COURSE AND CREDIT EVALUATION

An Evaluation of Transfer Records is mailed to the student by Enrollment Services. This evaluation lists courses that were completed at other institutions and provides an evaluation of them according to the following:

- courses accepted toward UM's general education requirement (GER) are designated by symbols (see General Education Notations below)
- courses in a category which has credit limitations are indicated (see Credit Maximum Notations, below)
- courses, if equivalent to UM courses, will be listed as such; courses without UM equivalencies, which satisfy a UM General Education Requirement (GER), will be listed as TR1 or TR2 (if lower division) or TR3 or TR4 (if upper division) followed by the appropriate GER notation, such as TR1H or TR1L; TR3H or TR3L

*Transfer courses which count toward two General Education Requirements will carry both notations. For example, HY counts toward the Historical and Cultural Studies group (H) and also the American and European Perspectives group (Y). **Credits transferred from a quarter or trimester program may be "rounded" for the purposes of satisfying GERs.**

Students Holding A.A. or A.S. Degrees or completion of Core

from Montana schools: Indicates that *lower-division* general education requirements have been met by completion of A.A. or A.S. degree or MUS Core. Upper-division requirements must still be met.

NOTE: A.A.S Degrees do not waive general education requirements.

A maximum of 60 credits in the student's major may be counted toward the baccalaureate degree, except some options in Health and Human Performance and Education, majors in Computer Science, and majors in the Schools of Business Administration, College of Visual and Performing Arts, Journalism, Law, The College of Health Professions and Biomedical Sciences and the College of Forestry and Conservation are allowed more. Students with combined majors, as opposed to two majors, are allowed to apply 75 credits in the major.

Credit Maximums

The amount of credit that can be applied towards the bachelor and associate degree is limited in certain areas. Credits beyond the maximum allowed remain on the permanent record. Symbols designating these areas for transfer courses are shown in (). These symbols appear on the permanent UM record.
