#### PROGRAM INFORMATION

Bitterroot college offers an affordable avenue to pursue a career in the healthcare industry. Students complete prerequisite & certification coursework at Bitterroot College and then apply for paramedicine program admission at Missoula College. Graduates earn their Associate of Science degree in Paramedicine preparing students to be excellent emergency responders who will play a vital role in life saving strategies. Students obtain hundred of hours of experiential, hands-on clinical training knowledge and skills to save lives. This program was designed to limit the number of times a student at Bitterroot College was required to drive to Missoula. This program does require some travel and has its own program fee of \$130 per credit.

#### CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Paramedics are employed by ambulance services, fire departments, within hospitals and as members of emergency flight crews. They employ life-saving strategies such as managing airways, establishing vascular access, performing CPR and administering pharmaceuticals, often while transporting patients to critical care facilities. Salaries can vary widely by assignment and company but the average EMT/Paramedic makes roughly \$45,000 according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics.
