

- 1. Identify the ethical dilemma. What is the ethical dilemma or the situation which seems to demand ethical analysis?
- 2. Identify those likely to be affected by the decision.

Who are the individuals, groups & communities that are likely to feel the impact of this decision in a significant way?

3. Identify all viable courses of action, including benefits & risks for each.

4. Examine the pros & cons for each course of action.

5. Consult with experts & colleagues.

6. Make the decision & document the decision-making process. What do you think the best decision is? How/where would you document this decision and decision-making process?

7. Implement the decision.

8. Monitor, evaluate & document the outcomes.

What resources do you need in order to monitor and evaluate the outcomes of the decision? How do you plan to evaluate the outcomes? What are the benchmarks you will be looking for as measures of success?
