□ PNAC Native Garden

The Ethnobotany Garden at the Payne Family Native American Center contains Native plants, shrubs and grasses of the Rocky Mountain West. Eight "Circle of Life" represent the diverse ecoregions of Montana and the Native American tribe or tribes that live within that region.

☐ M-Trail

The best known symbol of both UM and the City of Missoula is the giant concrete "M" on Mount Sentinel, sitting above 13 switchbacks and providing a panoramic view of the entire Missoula Valley. The trail is steep and takes about 20 minutes each way. Even if you only go up one switchback, the view is amazing.

The Fitness and Recreation Center (FRC) is located on the north end of campus, next to the Adams Center.
