MENTAL HEALTH FACILITATION FOR EDUCATORS:

BRIEF TRAINING

The main content of this course is the <u>PILOT</u> for the Brief version of the Mental Health Facilitation (MHF)-Educator's Edition (MHF-EE). It was adapted from the original MHF training developed in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO) and NBCC-International, a division of the National Board for Certified Counselors. It prepares educators to be helpful in a wide range of difficult situations with a multicultural and multidisciplinary focus in the school context. This is a hybrid course that includes online and face-to-face instruction. You will learn information through a wide range of instructional methods that will help you gain competence in school mental health and helping skills such as: understanding student's feelings; recognizing stress, distress, and disorder; communicating in the role of an MHF; working with child maltreatment; and making referrals and consulting with helping professionals, etc. This training IS NOT focused on depth and detail about mental health disorders and their specific interventions, rather about educators recognizing student/family/colleague needs and facilitating positive connections with various supports based on those needs.

Note: This is *not* a course that prepares professional counselors. It is designed to augment the skills of educators who work with diverse student populations in need.

Included in training: MHF-EE curriculum, coffee & tea breaks, lunch, MHF registry payment (\$20) - in other words those who successfully complete the training can be listed on the international registry of MHF's and creates opportunity to become a future trainer of this finalized curriculum.

Who can participate: Open to any K-12 educator in Montana (e.g., school counselors, teachers, administrators) - great to have <u>2</u> people from a school. There is a limit of 30 people and will be on a first come, first serve basis!
