Hike to the M! One of the most popular paths in Montana, the M Trail rises 620 feet above campus over ¾ of a mile using 13 switchbacks. The M itself is 100 feet high. If you need to clear your head or take a study break, UM's M Trail offers a mountain escape at the edge of campus. And for the more adventurous, additional trails lead 1,300 feet higher to the summit of Mount Sentinel ... and beyond.
