An ASN degree from Missoula College empowers students to become competent and caring individuals that assist in meeting the healthcare needs of the local community, region, state, nation, and the world. The nursing program offers small class sizes with a state-of-the-art skills lab. Financial aid is available for those who qualify, helping to open doors for anyone who wants to improve his or her education and career opportunities.

CAREER INFORMATION

Nursing is an incredibly diverse and rewarding career. Nurses are an essential element of the healthcare system, and demand continues to grow across Montana and the U.S. The Registered Nursing program at Missoula College--UM prepares students to take the National Council Licensure Exam (NCLEX-RN) and enter the workforce as skilled and competent entry-level nurses. Once graduates have successfully passed the NCLEX, they may be eligible to apply for licensure by endorsement in any of the 50 states. Montana is one of 34 states who belong to the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC). An RN is a high demand position and can work anywhere in the United States. In Montana, the average salary of an RN is \$74,000 through positions in hospitals, nursing homes, home healthcare, urgent care and physician offices.
