The APhA Pharmacy-Based Immunization Delivery certificate training program is an innovative, intensive, and practice-based continuing pharmacy education, based on national educational standards for immunization training from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This program is designed to educate pharmacists about the professional opportunities for vaccine advocacy and administration. This practice-based curriculum represents a fusion of science and clinical pharmacy. The program, which emphasizes a health care team approach, seeks to foster the implementation of interventions that will promote disease prevention and public health.

The goals of this program are to:

Educate pharmacists about:

- The impact of vaccines on public health.
- Pharmacists' roles in immunization.
- Immunologic principles of vaccine development and immunizations.
- Vaccine-preventable diseases and the vaccines used to prevent them.
- Strategies for improving immunization rates.
- Requirements for pharmacists who provide immunization services.

Prepare pharmacists to:

- * Read an immunization schedule and identify appropriate vaccines for individuals across the life span and with special needs.
- Educate patients about the benefits of vaccines and dispel myths about vaccines.
- Safely administer vaccines to patients via subcutaneous, intramuscular, intranasal, and intradermal routes.
- Operate an immunization service in compliance with legal and regulatory standards.
- Partner with immunization stakeholders to promote immunizations and the immunization neighborhood.

Direct pharmacists to resources necessary to:

- Promote public health through immunizations.
- Access regularly updated information about vaccines and their use.
- Effectively communicate with patients and other stakeholders about resources.
- Operate an immunization service in compliance with legal and regulatory standards.

This program is conducted in three parts:

- 1. **Self-study**: The self-study learning activity is designed to ensure that all participants have an understanding of vaccine-preventable diseases and the role of pharmacists as vaccine advocates and administrators. Prior to coming to the live seminar, the on-line self-study and assessment (80 question test) must be completed and a passing grade obtained on the assessment.
- 2. Live seminar on Zoom: The training seminar reinforces and expands on the self-study program, addressing areas such as applying ACIP immunization schedules, communicating with patients, and injection-technique training. Speakers for the seminar will include faculty knowledgeable about vaccine preventable diseases, immunizations, and their administration. Due to the pandemic, the live seminar will be presented on Zoom. (see technical requirements below)
- 3. Assessment of injection technique: After completion of the live seminar, the participant will be expected to demonstrate giving intramuscular (#2) and subcutaneous (#1) injections into a human arm. The participant will be responsible for recruiting a human subject to demonstrate the injection technique. The injections must be witnessed by an UM immunization faculty member either in person or using a remote visual format (ex. Zoom) to assess the correct technique was used for the injection. This sign off process needs to be completed within two weeks of the live seminar. Once you have successfully passed your injection technique assessment, you will be given directions to complete your final assessment, claim your credit, & to print your certificate of achievement.

Technical Requirements: Live Seminar

The Live Seminar portion will be conducted online. To participate, the registrants must:

- Join Zoom webinar by computer, tablet, or any mobile device
- Must have a working camera and have video enabled throughout the entire program
- Must be present for the entirety of the program to be eligible for completion of the certificate training
- There is a Zoom app that can be downloaded on mobile devices through the App Store or Google Play. Search for Zoom Cloud Meetings app.
- In planning to use a MacBook, Macbook Pro, MacBook Air, iMac, etc., please navigate to
 https://zoom.us/ (using the Mac computer that will be used for the Zoom session), click on the
 Download link at the right side of the screen, download and install/run the installer program (named
 Zoom.pkg).
- Join the meeting 15-30 minutes early to test that your microphone and camera is working properly and to check-in

- The Zoom Meeting Link and password will be sent 3 business days prior to the seminar

Virtual Training Consent:

The APhA Certificate Training Program hosted by the Skaggs School of Pharmacy will be offered in a virtual format. Zoom Video Conferencing will be used to deliver the live session.

By registering for this program, you agree to participate in the live portion of the course by using active video and audio feed through your computer or mobile device. Additionally, you agree to complete the skills assessment found in program description. Credit for completion of the certificate program will only be granted to participants who complete the self-study requirements, are verified as physically present throughout the duration of the live session, complete the skills process with a passing assessment, and receive a passing score on the online post-test.

CPE Monitor

All Pharmacists must register for a NABP eProfile ID number via <u>CPE Monitor</u> in order to receive continuing education credits. The Continuing Professional Education Office no longer mails credits to eligible recipients, rather, credits are uploaded to the CPE Monitor tracking service. Pharmacists and can now easily track their ACPE credits via CPE Monitor.
