Capstone Courses (APE & ILE)

PUBH 595 – APPLIED PRACTICE EXPERIENCE

- Internship or practicum experience
- Site can be health department, government agency (DPHHS), or non-profit organizations
- Sites have been all over the world
- Win-win student and site
- May not be part of employees normal job description

PUBH 594 – INTEGRATED LEARNING EXPERIENCE

- Professional paper completed near the end of MPH program
- Demonstrates synthesis and integration of public health knowledge
- White paper, policy paper, research paper, strategic plan








Applied Practice Experience (APE)

- 4-6 month internship/practicum year-round
- Planned, supervised, and evaluated practice experience working with a site mentor.
- Provides student with the opportunity to gain public health knowledge and skills
- Culminates in 2 defined final projects/deliverables.
- Required experience for all students in the MPH program.
- Can be done on-site or remotely.









Public Health Competencies

Examples of Foundational Competencies

- Select quantitative and qualitative data collection methods appropriate for a given public health context
- Assess population needs, assets and capacities that affect communities' health
- Design a population-based policy, program, project or intervention
- Propose strategies to identify stakeholders and build coalitions and partnerships for influencing public health outcomes
- Communicate audience-appropriate public health content, both in writing and through oral presentation

Concentration-Specific Competencies

- Gather, integrate and analyze descriptive health data from rural or frontier settings.
- Identify the common demographic characteristics of rural or frontier areas and their implications for provision of public health services.
- Explain the challenges associated with provision of environmental health services in the context of rural or frontier areas.





Expectations of site mentor and student

Site Mentor

- Passion and commitment to work with student for duration of the project
- Monitor students progress
- Ensure student has access to necessary tools
- Meet with Academic Advisor and student at least once
- Attend final presentation to SPCHS faculty at end of the semester
- Approve student's successful completion

Student

- Complete two identified products in time allotted
- Communicate with site mentor and AA when schedule changes
- Maintain professionalism at all times
- Development of APE proposal
- IRB application (if required)
- Development of APE portfolio at the end of the project


