### Lennon Keppen

Master of Public Health (MPH) Student

Lennon Keppen, RHIA, is a secondgeneration healthcare professional with previous professional background in Health Information Management (HIM) and is certified as a Registered Health Information Administrator (RHIA). Lennon works for the state of Montana Immunization Program, providing training and support to Montana's Immunization Information System (ISS).

Lennon supports imMTrax, Montana's Immunization Information System (IIS). Immunization Information Systems are confidential, population-based, computerized databases that record immunization doses administered by participating providers residing within a given area. imMTrax is a population-level public health information system that stores immunization data for Montanans at all stages of life. The data from imMTrax allows the public to request a longitudinal record of immunizations for childcare, school, employment, travel and more.

IIS data can help improve medical care. Vaccine data can be used to inform clinical decision making. As the IIS Training & Support Specialist; Lennon assists with the daily operations of imMTrax. Lennon provides support to end users through training and education about the system. Lennon handles all end-user access processing.

Lennon supports partner organizations that send data electronically through an interface data exchange and responds to questions about system functionality to partners and the public. Lennon also handles requests for immunization records that come in through the state office.

#### Dustin Webb

B-Rad is an Infectious Disease Specialist at the Missoula City-County Health Department.

B-Rad loves to engage in community health outreach activities and serve as a resource for the medical community in Missoula. B-Rad's primary responsibility is to follow up on roughly 70 infectious diseases required by law to be reported to the health department with the goal of interrupting the chain of transmission.

B-Rad started his career at MCCHD in July 2016 after finishing his Bachelor of Science in nursing. Starting in the outpatient clinic administering vaccines and working part-time in the infectious disease office, B-Rad fell in love with infectious disease work and within a year began the Master's in Public Health program at the University of Montana.

During this time, B-Rad began working on HIV outreach, offering HIV testing, counseling and education in nonclinical settings. B-Rad became aware of the relationship between stigma and infectious diseases in his graduate coursework and incorporated evidence-based practices to reduce stigma with outreach work.

B-Rad also loves to engage in community health outreach activities, including teaching students about sexually transmitted infectious, offering vaccines in nonclinical settings, educating wildland firefighters about infectious diseases they may encounter on the job, and serving as a resource for the medical community in Missoula.

#### Jacob Brown

Jacob Brown is a CPH student and works for the Public Health Emergency
Preparedness department of the Montana
Department of Public Health and Human Services
(DPHHS). Jacob was heavily involved in the COVID19 response and leaned on his experience as a wildland firefighter with FEMA's Incident Command Systems (ICS) throughout the pandemic, helping public health entities to be trained on ICS to use in their facilities.

Jacob received his Bachelor's degree in Emergency Management from Utah Valley University and, a year later, transferred to Miles City, MT where he continued with the BLM as an assistant on a wildland fire engine. In 2018, Jacob moved to Helena, MT to pursue a career with his Emergency Management degree, finding a job as an Emergency Management Specialist with DPHHS.

Jacob has been married almost 13 years and has two boys, ages 7 and 4, and a one year old daughter.
